BACKGROUND

In accordance with the project of Marcel David, professor of History and founder of the ISST, the Labour Institutes are a meeting place between the academic world and the trade union world. They take part in the training of trade union activists and representatives who, due to their mandate and the responsibilities they assume, wish to supplement their experience with university-level teaching. The Institute of Social Sciences of Labour of Bourg-la-Reine, like the Labour Institute of Strasbourg, has a national competence.

ECONOMIC, SOCIAL AND TRADE UNION TRAINING (F.E.S.S.)

The ISST is authorised to provide training within the framework of the Economic, Social and Trade Union Training Leave (F.E.S.S.). It benefits from an approval delivered by the Ministry of Labour. Twelve tenured professor-researchers from the University of Paris 1 Panthéon-Sorbonne, from various disciplines of the human and social sciences (law, economics, sociology and education sciences) are assigned to the Institute to provide these training courses. .

LABOUR COURT TRAINING

The ISST also organizes training sessions for the labour counsellors of each of the trade union organizations.

RESEARCH

The ISST hosts a team of researchers attached to the IDHE.S-CNRS laboratory "Institutions and Historical Dynamics of the Economy and Society " (UMR CNRS 8533).

THE DOCUMENTATION CENTRE

In order to carry out its various missions, ISST has a documentation centre specialised in social sciences of labour.

The Institute's library collection, organized around the themes of the trade union movement, employee training, social protection, labour history, economics, sociology and labour law, consists of more than 25,000 documents (monographs, manuals, theses and dissertations, research reports, etc.) and a collection of nearly 400 journals, including 90 journals to which the centre has an active subscription.
